Ans. Coefficient is a number or letter prefixed to a quantity, to show how many times the quantity is to be taken. Ex.  $12ab$ . In this example 12 is the coefficient. Hence, a coefficient is a multiplier or factor. Coefficients may be numeral, literal, or mixed.

An Exponent or Index of a power, is a figure or letter placed at the right, above the quantity.

Thus  $a^1$  denotes  $a$ , or the first power of  $a$ .

"  $a^2$  "  $a \times a$ , the square, or second power.

"  $a^3$  "  $a \times a \times a$ , the cube, or third power.

A Polynomial is the expression of a quantity of two or more terms, connected by the sign plus, or minus. Hence  $(ab+cd)$  or  $(a+b+c-d)$  is a polynomial.

2. Show that the product of two minus quantities is plus.

Ans. The multiplier with + before it, expressed or understood, means that the multiplicand is to be taken so many times to be added; and the multiplier with - before means that the multiplicand is taken so many times to be subtracted. Thus,

$$1. +3 \times (+5) = (+5) + (+5) + (+5) \text{ or } (+15).$$

$$2. +3 \times (-5) = (-5) + (-5) + (-5) \text{ or } (-15)$$

$$3. -3 \times (+5) = -(+5) - (+5) - (+5) \text{ or } (-15)$$

$$4. -3 \times (-5) = -(-5) - (-5) - (-5) \text{ or } (+15)$$

3. Divide  $12a^6b^8x$  by  $4a^3b^2x$ . Ans.  $12a^6b^8x \bigg| 4a^3b^2x$   
 $\frac{12a^6b^8x}{3a^3b^6}$  Ans.

Explanation. The division of one quantity by another is produced by cancelling the factors that are common to both dividend and divisor. The factors of the dividend are,  $2 \times 2 \times 3 a a a a a a b b b b b b b b x$ . The factors of the divisor are,  $2 \times 2 a a b b x$ . The factors not common to dividend and divisor are  $3 a a a b b b b b b$ .

$$\therefore 12a^6b^8x \div 4a^3b^2x = 3a^3b^6 \text{ Ans.}$$

4. In the equation  $4x + 4 = a - 3x = 4x + 3x + 4 = a$   
 $= 7x + 4 = a$ ;  $7x = a - 4$ ;  $x = \frac{a-4}{7}$  Let  $x = 2$ , Then  
 will  $7x + 4 = 18 = a$ .  $\frac{18-4}{7} = 2 = x$ . Transposing terms of an equation if the signs are changed does not alter the value.

A Radical Quantity is an expression which contains the radical sign. Ex.  $2\sqrt{3}$ ,  $3\sqrt[3]{4}$ ,  $2 \times 5^{\frac{1}{2}}$ ,  $x + \sqrt[3]{a}$ , are radical quantities.

Similar Radicals are those which have a common radical factor. Thus,  $5\sqrt[3]{3}$  and  $6\sqrt[3]{3}$  are similar.

7. Prove that the square root of the product of two quantities is equal to the product of their square roots.

Let  $x =$  one quantity

"  $y =$  the other.

Then  $xy =$  the product.

$\sqrt{xy} =$  the sq. root of product.

$\sqrt{xy^2} = xy =$  product.

$\sqrt{xy} = \sqrt{x} \times \sqrt{y}$  Ans.

Proof. Let  $x = 25$  &  $y = 36$  then

$\sqrt{25} = 5$ ;  $\sqrt{36} = 6$ ;  $5 \times 6 = 30$

N.B. An even root of a negative quantity cannot be found. It is therefore said to be impossible.

An even root of a negative quantity is called an Imaginary Quantity.

Thus the  $\sqrt{-4}$ ,  $\sqrt{-a^2}$ ,  $\sqrt[4]{-a^2}$  are imaginary quantities.

(No. 1.)

Discuss the subjects of Algebraic Signs and Quantities — under Definitions and Notation.

Algebraic Signs are as follows: + called plus, when placed between two quantities means that they are to be added. A short horizontal dash thus (-) placed between two quantities shows that their difference is to be taken. Ex.  $4-2$ ;  $a-b$ ;  $12axy - 9axy$ .

The sign of Multiplication is an oblique cross thus: X and . each of which signifies that the quantity which

precedes it is to be multiplied by the one that follows it. Thus in each of the expressions  $a \times b$  and  $a \cdot b$ , the sign of multiplication signifies that  $a$  is to be multiplied by  $b$ . and each is read, "a into b, or" "a multiplied by b."

The sign of multiplication may be omitted in monomial of any degree thus;  $ab$ ,  $3ab$ ,  $6axy$ ,  $12a^2y^4x^7z^{10}$ , signifies, that the figures and letters of each term are factors.

There are three ways of expressing division in Algebra, viz. —  $a \div b$ ,  $\frac{a}{b}$ ,  $\frac{a}{b}$ , each of which shows that "a is to be divided by b." Also  $12a^6b^{14}c^3x^2 \div 4a^3b^2yx$ .

The double sign  $\pm$  signifies either plus or minus. Ex.  $a \pm b$  signifies that  $b$  taken from  $a$  may be either positive or negative, The double sign  $\mp$  is read either plus or minus. The inverted double sign  $\mp$  is read either minus or plus.

### Symbols of Aggregation.

The symbols of aggregation are the Parenthesis,  $()$ ; the Vinculum,  $—$ ; the Brackets,  $[ ]$ ; and the Brace,  $\{ \}$ . Thus,  $(a-b)c$ , which is read "parenthesis  $a-b$  into  $c$ ", signifies that the result of subtracting  $b$  from  $a$  is to be multiplied by  $c$ .

The expressions  $(a-b)c$ ,  $a-b \times c$ ,  $[a-b] \times c$ , and  $\{a-b\}c$ , are equivalent.

The vinculum is sometimes placed in a vertical.  
Thus  $\overline{a-b}$  is equivalent to  $a-b \times c$ .

### Symbols of Relation.

The sign of Equality = signifies that the quantities between which it is placed are equal.

Thus  $xy = a-b$ , or  $x^2 + 2xy + y^2 = (x+y)(x+y)$ .

The signs of Inequality are  $>$  and  $<$ , each of which signifies that the quantities between which it is placed are unequal, the opening being turned toward the greater quantity. Thus,  $x+y > a-b$ ,  $b < ab$ .

### Notation.

Quantities in Algebra are expressed by letters or by a combination of letters and figures; as,  $a$ ,  $b$ ,  $c$ ,  $3x$ ,  $4y$ ,  $5z$ , etc.

The first letters of the alphabet are used to express known quantities; the last letters those which are unknown.

The Letters employed have no fixed numerical value of themselves. Any letter may represent any number with this limitation, the same letter must always stand for the same value or number thro' out the same problem.

## No. 2. Fractions.

Give definitions of Terms, and of the Real and Apparent Signs; from examples wrought, deduce the general principles of Operation; discuss the different cases of Reduction.

The Terms of a fraction are its numerator & denominator.

The Numerator of a fraction is the expression above the line, and shows how many parts are taken.

The Denominator of a fraction is the expression below the line, and shows into how many parts the unit is divided.

An Integer is a quantity which consists of one or more entire units only; as,  $a$ ,  $4a$ ;  $98$ ,  $7$ ,  $9$ ,  $265$ . etc.

A Mixed Quantity is one which contains an integer and a fraction; as,  $a + \frac{m}{n}$ ,  $a - \frac{14a}{c}$ .

The Value of a fraction is the quotient of the numerator divided by the denominator. Thus the value of 12 fourths is  $12 \div 4$  which is 3.  $\frac{12m}{3} = 4m$ .

A Simple Fraction is a fraction whose terms are entire. Thus,  $\frac{a}{c}$ ,  $\frac{a-b}{c+m}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{8+10}{20-10}$ , are simple fractions.

A Complex Fraction is a fraction which has a fraction in one or both of its terms. Thus,  $\frac{a-b}{d+e}$  and  $\frac{a+\frac{b}{c}}{d+f}$  are complex fractions.



## Signs of Fractions.

Every Fraction has the sign + or - expressed or understood, before the dividing line.

The Dividing Line has the force of the vinculum or parenthesis, and the sign before it shows that the value of the whole fraction is to be added or subtracted.

Every Numerator and Denominator is preceded by the sign plus or minus expressed or understood. In this case the sign affects only the single term to which it is prefixed.

If the sign before the Dividing Line is changed from + to -, or from - to plus +, the value of the fraction is changed from + to -, or from - to +.

Thus,  $a + \frac{bx - cx - dx}{x} = a + b - c - d$ ; but  $a - \frac{bx - cx - dx}{x} = a - b + c + d$

If all the signs of the Numerator are changed, the value of the fraction is changed in a corresponding manner. Thus  $\frac{+ax + bx}{x} = +a + b$ ; but  $\frac{-ax - bx}{x} = -a - b$ .

If all the signs of the Denominator are changed, the Value is also changed in a corresponding manner. Thus,  $\frac{ax}{+x} = +a$ ; but  $\frac{ax}{-x} = -a$ . Hence,

If any two of these changes are made at the same time, they will balance each other and the value of the fraction will not be altered. Thus,  $\frac{ab}{b} = \frac{-ab}{-b} = -\frac{-ab}{b} = -\frac{ab}{-b} = +a$  \*

\* Also,  $-\frac{ab}{b} = -\frac{ab}{b} = -\frac{-ab}{-b} = -\frac{ab}{-b} = +a$  \*

The Apparent Sign of a fraction is the sign prefixed to the dividing line of the fraction. Thus, the apparent sign of  $\frac{a-b}{c}$  is plus.

The Real Sign of a fraction is the sign of its numerical value. Thus, the real sign of  $\frac{a-b}{c}$  is - if  $a=6$ ,  $b=8$ , and  $c=5$ .

Th. If the apparent sign of a fraction, or the sign of each term of the numerator, or the sign of each term of the denominator, be changed, the real sign of the fraction will be changed. Thus,  $\frac{ab}{b} = a$ , but  $-\frac{ab}{b} = -a$ .  $\frac{ab-bc}{b} = a-c$ ; but  $-\frac{ab+bc}{b} = -a+c$ , and  $\frac{a^2-b^2}{a-b} = a+b$ ; but  $\frac{a^2-b^2}{-a+b} = -a-b$ .

Cor. If any two of these changes be made at the same time, the real sign of the fraction will not be changed. Thus  $\frac{ab}{b} = a$ , and  $\frac{-ab}{-b} = a$ .

## Reduction of Fractions

Reduction of Fractions is changing their terms without altering the value of the fraction.

### Case II.

To reduce a fraction to its lowest terms.

Fractions are reduced to their lowest terms when all of the common factors of the terms are cancelled.

$$\frac{5a^2b^2dx}{15abex} \text{ reduced} = \frac{abd}{3c}; \text{ and } \frac{x^2 - 4y^2}{x^2 - 2xy + y^2} = \frac{x+4y}{x-y}$$

### Case III.

To Reduce a Mixed Quantity to an Improper Fraction.

$b\frac{1}{7} = \frac{43}{7}$  Reduce  $x - \frac{(a^2 - x^2)}{x}$  to the form of a fraction.

$$x - \frac{a^2 - x^2}{x} = \frac{x^2 - (a^2 - x^2)}{x} = \frac{2x^2 - a^2}{x}, \text{ Ans.}$$

### Case IIII.

To Reduce a Fraction to a Whole or Mixed Quantity.

Reduce  $\frac{2a + 4b + c}{2} = a + 2b + \frac{c}{2}$

### Case IV.

To Reduce an Integer to a Fraction having any required Denominator. — Reduce  $3a$  to  $5$ ths.

$$3a = \frac{3a}{1}; \quad \frac{3a \times 5}{1 \times 5} = \frac{15a}{5}. \text{ Hence, the}$$

Rule. — Multiply the integer by the required denominator, and place the product over it.

### Case V.

To Reduce a Fraction to any Required Denominator.

Change  $\frac{c}{4}$  to a fraction whose denominator is  $3b$ .

$$3b \div 4 = 9. \quad \frac{c \times 9}{4 \times 9} = \frac{9c}{36}. \text{ Hence, the}$$

Rule. — Divide the required denominator by the denominator of the given fraction, and multiply both terms by the quotient.

### No. 3. Simple Equations.

Containing two or more unknown quantities; discuss and illustrate by examples, the subject of Elimination by Substitution, by Comparison, by Addition & Sub<sup>trac</sup>tion.

#### Elimination by Substitution.

## Elimination by Comparison.

### No. 5

Quadratic Equations containing one unknown quantity; define Pure and Affected Quadratics: discuss the method of Completing the Square.

A Pure Quadratic contains the square only of the unknown quantity; as,  $x^2 = b$ .

An Affected Quadratic contains both the first and second powers of the unknown quantity; as,  ~~$x^2 + ax = cd$~~   
 $x^2 + ax = cd$ , also  $x^2 \pm ax = b$ . also,  $x^2 + 2ax = b$ .

In the expression  $x^2 + 2ax$ , the first term is a perfect square, and the second term consists of the factors  $2a$  and  $x$ . But  $x$  is the root of the first term  $x^2$ ; therefore  $2a$  must be twice the root of the third term which is required to

complete the square. Hence half of  $2a$  must be the root of the third term and  $a^2$  the term itself. Therefore  $x^2 + 2ax + a^2$  is the square of the first member completed. But since we have added  $a^2$  to the first member of the equation, we must add  $a^2$  to the second member to preserve the equality. Extracting the square root of both members, and transposing  $a$  we have,  $x = -a \pm \sqrt{a^2 + b}$ , the value sought.

No. 6.

### Arithmetical Progression.

Develop and interpret the formulas for the Last Term, and for the Sum of the Series.

An Arithmetical Progression is a series which increases or decreases by a constant quantity called the common difference.

In Arithmetical Progression there are five elements to be considered: the first term, the common difference, the last term, the number of terms, and the Sum of the terms.

Let  $a$  = the first term      Let  $n$  = the number of terms

"  $d$  = the common difference "  $s$  = the sum of the terms.

"  $l$  = the last term

The relation of these five quantities to each other is such that if any three of them are given, the other two can be found. Case II.

The first term, the common difference, and number of terms given, to find the last term

$a, a+d, a+2d, a+3d$  etc. or  $a, a-d, a-2d, a-3d$ , etc.

Formula II.  $l = a \pm (n-1)d.$

Interpretation of Formula. — The last term equals the first, plus or minus the number of terms minus 1 multiplied by the common difference.

Case III.

The First and Last Terms and the Number of Terms being given to find the Sum of the Series.

Let  $a, a+d, a+2d, a+3d, \dots, l$ , be an arithmetical progression, the sum of which is required.

Since the sum of two or more quantities is the same in whatever order they are added, we have

$$s = a, a+d, a+2d, a+3d, + \dots + l.$$

Inverting  $s = l, l-d, l-2d, l-3d, + \dots + a.$

Adding  $2s = a+b + (a+b) + (a+b) + (a+b) + \dots + a+l$

$\therefore 2s = (a+b)$  taken  $n$  times or as many times as there are terms in the series. That is  $2s = (a+b)n$

Hence the

Formula III.  $S = \frac{(a+b) \times n}{2}$

Interpretation. The Sum equals (the first term plus the last term) multiplied by the number of terms the product being divided by 2. or,

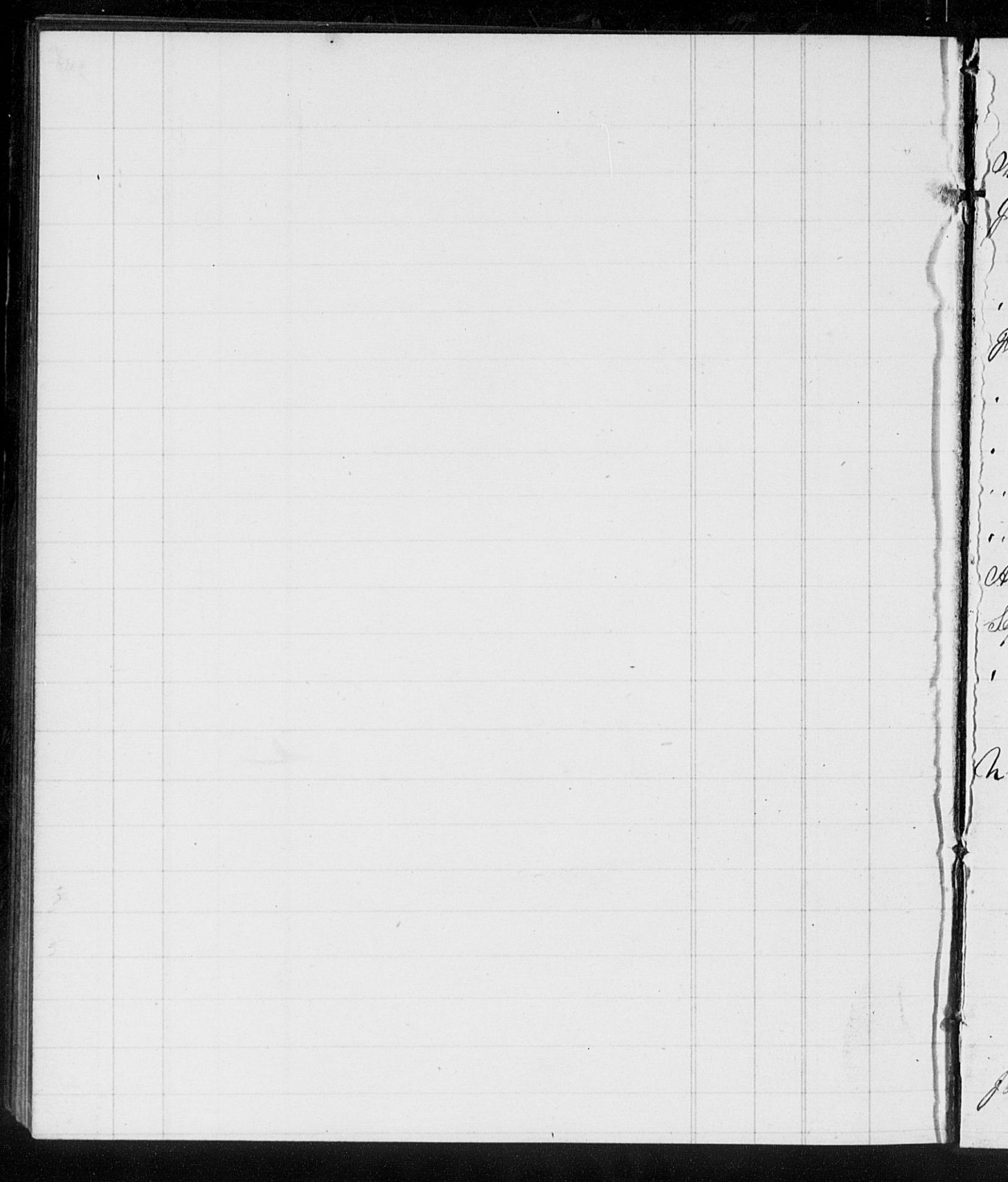
The Sum equals half the sum of the first and last terms multiplied by the number of terms.
