Items regarding North Family Water
Supply and Pipe lines —

Reservoir

Keep surface of water below the
earth bank. —

To lower the surface of water
remove the wooden guide level
on side of the overflow flume.

To empty the Reservoir first
close the valve in the pipe from
the Pond. This valve is under a cover

2 feet west from the strainer
in the Pond.

The valve opens by turning
to the right. The long key for
opening it is kept at the house.

To close it of course turn to the
left.

From this point the pipe to the

Reservoir winds around the edge of
 the hill ^{and turns} to the South at a ditch
 near a row of willows then
 crosses ^{under the East Farm road} ~~the road, which leads to the~~
~~East Farm~~, and passes above a
 boiler-shell tank set in the ground
 for watering cattle, (a spur from
 the pipe lets water into this tank)
 The supply pipe can be followed ~~to~~
 from this point in its course to the
 North end of the Reservoir.

In the North end of the reservoir,
~~an~~ an iron pipe is driven standing
 up 2 feet which marks the place
 where the supply pipe enters
 This ^{short} pipe can sometimes be seen
 from the bank opposite where the
 iron indicator stands

The supply pipe in the reservoir
 follows along the bottom on the west
 side to the outlet Strainer at bottom.

To empty the Reservoir

At the South-west Corner, on the road below, a few feet from the State highway, is a flag stone covering a shut off which when opened, along with the hydrants below, will drain the Reservoir -
