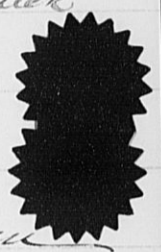

Know all men by these presents, That we
William Lawton and William C. Pillsbury
and firmly binds unto Robert M. Wagon of Mount
Lebanon in the sum of One Thousand Dollars
lawful money of the United States to be paid to the said Robert
M. Wagon his executor administrators or assigns; for
which payment well and truly to be made we bind our
selves, our and each of our heirs executors and ad-
ministrators jointly, and severally, finally by these presents
Sealed with our seals Dated this 10th day of July 1879
Whereas the said Robert M. Wagon heretofore did make exe-
cute and deliver unto the above bounden William Lawton
for a valuable consideration his certain check for the
sum of Five Hundred Dollars bearing date the first day
of November 1877 on the Agricultural National Bank
of Pittsfield Massachusetts, which said check the
said William Lawton since the delivery thereof to him
has lost or has been stolen from him and whereas
said Wagon has given notice to said Bank of the loss of
said check and payment of the same by said Bank
for bills and said check has never been paid by said
Bank or presented for payment all as alleged by
said Wagon, and whereas the said Wagon has on the delivery
paid unto the said William Lawton the sum of Five
Hundred Dollars the receipt whereof the said William
Lawton doth hereby acknowledge in full of said check
upon the promise of the said William Lawton to in-
demnify and save harmless the said Robert M. Wagon
on the premises And therefore the condition of this

Obligation is such that if the above named William Lawton his
heirs, executors administrators or any of them do and shall at all times here
after sue or suffer harm in the said Robert W. Mayes his heirs executors and
administration of firm and against all Costs and Damages that may arise
from said Check being presented hereafter for payment and refusal
of payment thereof then this obligation to be voided and
to remain in full force and reasonable notice is to be given
by said Mayes to W. C. Daly of Chatham Village N.Y. attorney of said Lawton
of any claim that may be hereafter made by any party on said Check
