

This Indenture, made the first day of March in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty two. Between Robert White Junr. and Hannah G. his wife of the City and State of New York, of the First part - And Jonathan Wood and Edward Fowler Trustees of the United Society of Believers, called Shakers, of the town of New Lebanon, Columbia County and state aforesaid, of the Second part Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand five hundred dollars lawful money of the United States of America to them in hand paid, by the said parties of the second part, at or before the sealing and delivery of this presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have remised, released, and quit-claimed, and by these presents do remise, release and quit-claim unto the said parties of the second part, and to their heirs and assigns forever, All that certain piece and parcel of Land lying and being in the town of Canaan, Columbia County and state aforesaid, bounded as follows - viz - Beginning on the West side of Whiting's Pond, at the North East corner on the road leading from New Lebanon to Hudson, thence along said road Southerly to lands now and lately owned by Moses I West, thence Westerly along the lands of said West to lands of the heirs of Benjamin Hall deceased; thence Northwardly along said lands to lands formerly belonging to Aaron Pills to the place of beginning, containing thirty acres: be the same more or less, it being the same piece of land formerly owned by Cushman Polly of Canaan aforesaid, and conveyed to the said Robert White Junr. by George W Horton and wife by deed dated 25th day of March 1851 and recorded in book T.T. of Deeds, page 16. - Also that other certain piece or parcel of land adjoining, Beginning at the South East corner of the above described land, thence along the southerly line of the Cushman Polly farm, North eighty degrees West five chains and forty two links to two walnut trees; thence South fifty nine degrees East five chains fifty six links to a stake and stones on the West line of the road; thence North sixteen degrees East two chains to the place of beginning containing One half acre of land be the same more or less; and the same as conveyed by the said Moses I West to the said Robert White Junr. by deed dated 8th day of May 1851. and recorded in Book T.T. of Deeds page 235. 236.

Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof. And also, all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said parties of the first part, of, in, or to the above described premises, and every part and parcel thereof, with the appurtenances. To have and to hold, all and singular the above mentioned and described premises, together with the appurtenances, unto the said parties of the second part and their heirs and assigns forever - In trust nevertheless, to and for the sole use and benefit of the United Society aforesaid; to be enjoyed, managed, improved and disposed of by or under the superintendance and direction of the Deacons or acting Trustees who may from time to time be duly appointed and chosen according to the covenant and constitution of the Church in said United Society to take charge of and manage their temporal estate and concerns in behalf of and for the use and benefit of the said United Society, according to the true meaning and intent of the said covenant and constitution, and for no other use and purpose whatever. . . .
