I inclose deed for your examination. It is a copy of the deed we received. I also have added a deed of the 96 acre piece that lays along the river. Along about 1765 a warrant of 12000 acres called the Walker Pampac Manor survey was taken out of the Land Office and our tract is a piece of it.
