will remain with you so long as
you remain here below, and in
Eternity they will meet you to
welcome you to your happy
home. And on their Wings

Come come my beloved one, yea
one in whom I am well pleased: and
one indeed, in whom I do delight.

Surely it is with true pleasure, that
I, your Mother dear, do at this time,
spend a moment to speak unto thee
comforting words, or to write unto
thee, that you may have your Mo-
ther's word of consolation to peruse

(2)

at your leisure, when my voice you
cannot hear, as you now do. So come
come I say, come near to your Mother,
and hear my word. For my word,
is Love, Peace, Comfort and Strength,
to you, My dearly beloved, at this
time. Dear Child, Well has
your Mother ever known the deep
and heavy scenes of indeed true
tribulation and mortification which
you have passed thro'; yea, even

(3)

in your childhood. And rest ye assured, it is all sealed in the Holy Record of Heaven.

May may, by no means have your repeated hours of trial and sorrow been forgotten, or left unnumbered by your Parents above. For by the Holy Angels that have for many years guarded my first-born, and the little ones that they gathered & nourished in the first years of the

gospel, I say, by these Holy Angels of tidings, that good things have often been sounded in our ears, to the great joy and comfort of your Parents above. Yea your name, my well-beloved one, has often been mentioned among the truly faithful and cheerful cross-bearers of my children on earth: And many, very many times, has your beloved Mother Lucy spoken of you, her

well-beloved child while on earth. She says you did never forsake nor turn from her or her word, while she was on earth. Therefore she has never forgotten you, but has ever remembered you in the purest of love love.

All this, dear child, was the careful notice of your ever-watchful & loving Mother, even in years and times past, before my Heavenly Father listened to, and answered my often,

repeated, and most earnest and humble supplication, in behalf of our needy children on earth, and granted me permission to return again and dwell among them.

But O my Beloved, I must stop short and say, How can I find words to express the many hours of sweetest joy and true pleasure which I your Mother have witnessed within four years, while in your presence.

You may say, Why so? And I will tell you. It is because you have listened with patience to the sound of my voice, and owned my word (and denied it not. Yea indeed altho my word has been, many times a word of sorrow upon sorrow, — grief upon grief, and trial upon trial — with tribulation upon tribulation, yet you have ever received it with a free and thankful heart, at all times;

loving your Mother with true (and perfect love; and this has been joy to me, even when my spirit has been weighed down in bitter grief.

Again hear ye my word, and know ye beloved that I your Mother, your loving Mother, have walked by your side. Yea, hand in hand have we walked thro trying scenes. And tho' you knew it not, I have led you by my right hand, hours and hours

at a time: and in no one instance, of trial and sorrow that has come upon you for Thirty Five years past, has my hand of true protection been withheld, nor my eye of care been closed upon you. Nay nay and never shall be thro' time.

For why should a Parent ever forget or forsake a child, that has ever been truly faithful. Yea, one that has ever been, indeed ready and willing to come at the call

of my voice. So now let thy Mother's word, and thy Mother's love, serve to support thee, in, and thro' all crossing (and trying) hours.

Remember O Beloved, thy Mother of deep sorrow, and forget me not, when I shall return to my mansion above. And know ye, I will bear thee thro' the beating billows of time, safely. My guardian Angels shall guard thee, I justified spirits shall be with thee

thro' time. Others fear not, but press
on thy journey with good courage:
for if you, my beloved one, suffer
heavy tribulation for the sake of the
increase of the gospel, I, your Mother,

er, then I will ever be ready for thee.
And when thy faithful labours & hard
toils are finished, in my Heavenly
Father's Vinyard below, then shall you

Yea even the reward of a Well done, Good,
and Faithful Child of your Mother.
A beautiful Robe, and a shining Crown;
I have with my own hand prepared

In a Holy Mansion of Heavenly

dwell. Yea, and your soul shall feast
upon the richest of my riches, and

drink at my pure Spring of ever-living waters. You shall never be left to grow faint nor weary; for the Angels of my own Mansions shall have charge of thee, because I have ever found thee true to thy trust, true to thy Mother in Heaven, and true to thy own soul. Yea I say, it is for these reasons, that I have, at this time, felt to leave

my heavy burdens of sorrow, I write these few words unto you my truly faithful child; that you may be assured that you are not, nay, nor ever have been forgotten by me, your Mother.

To receive ye this little book, I know it is My Mother's word, and My Mother's love. My Mother's strength, My Mother's comfort, and My Mother's everlasting peace, now and forever.

It is only a token of the reward

that is in store for you, when you have done with time. So be ye comforted, fear no more, and grieve no more; cheerfully press on, thro' all trying hours, ever remembering the word of your blessed and loving Mother Ann, and my promises unto you, written here in this little Book.

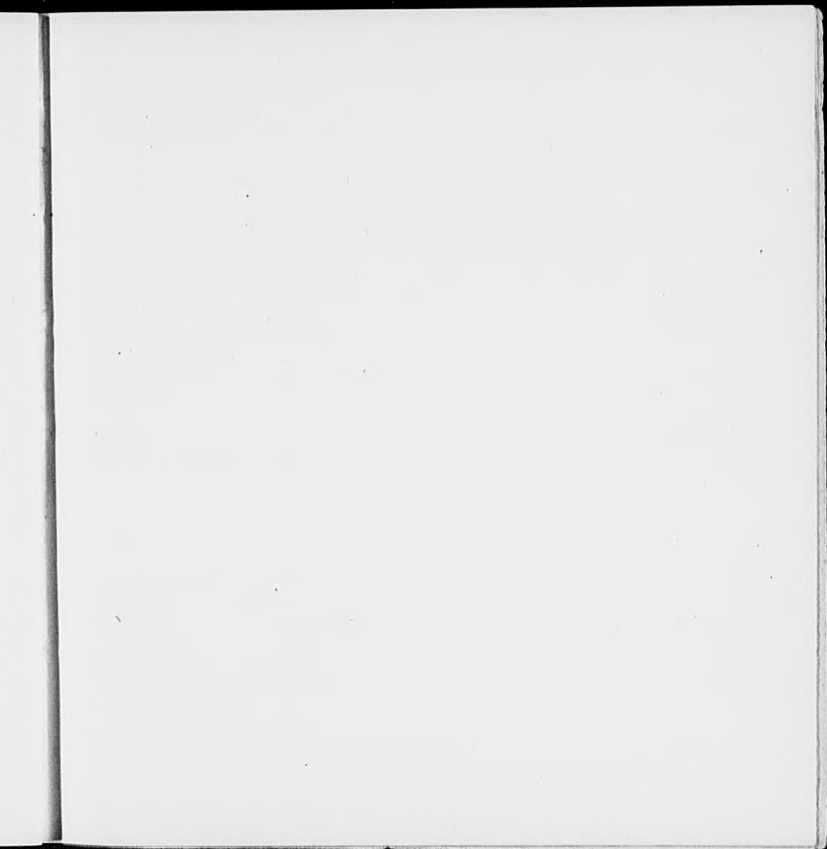
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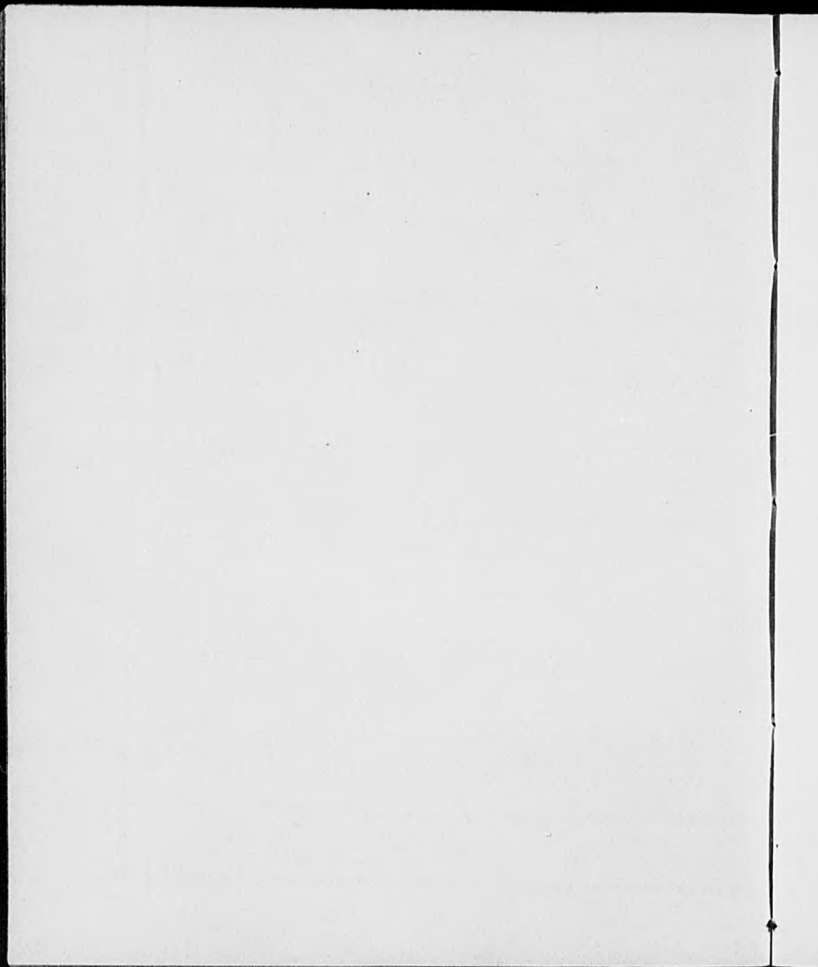
The book is now nearly full,

"There seemed," said Mother Lucy, "to be some meaning to this, Mother's work, at this time. But, I cannot

say, what it is. ⁽²⁾ But, Beloved, call
in the sisters, and I will do my errand."

After I had received my book,
the other sisters were called in, one at
a time; according to their ages.

Namely. Elizabeth Lovegrove,

Sarah Bates.

Prudence Morrell.

Angelic Vedder.

Joanna Hitchel.

Eliza Sharp. &

Sally Dean.

Mother Lucy gave them their books,

(3.)

saying. "Sisters, your Blessed Mother Ann, has sent you a book. It is the Record of your lives. She has ever kept them, until now. But now, she has sent them unto you; thinking it might be pleasing to you, to have them."

"For in these books," ^{Said Mother Ann.} "I have correctly stated the deeds of your lives: with the sure rewards, for all the crosses you have cheerfully taken up.

And all the trials and tribulation you have passed through; till you was 30. years of age. —————

And from that time, your little Angel, has, and will, correctly stated for you, the remainder of your life."

"Do you want this little Book?"

M. Lucy, "I know you do." "You need not be afraid to take it," said Mother.

Mother's Second visit, to the fore mentioned class of sisters. May 14th. 1841.

Friday, 5 o'clock, P. M. The above mentioned sisters were again called upon, by Mother Lucy, who spoke as follows. — "Do you remember that Mother Ann gave you a Little Book, some time ago? Yea, was the answer. Was you pleased with it? Yea, both pleased and thankful for it. — What else did you have? Did I not bring you something else? Yea, Mother's

love and blessing, was the answer.

Mother then turned to me, Betsy, and said. Well, what have you done with your book? It is on my head, I answered Mother. — Do you want to know how it looks? Yea, I answered.

Well, take your book from your head, and place it in your right hand; and turn the leaves with your other hand. Turn them fast, that I may view them. I never have seen your books, though Mother Ann has seen them a great many times. Why, that is

a pretty book, is it not? It is all
clean and white. Look cheerful
sisters. Don't be cast down, said Mother.

Then turning to me again, she
said. And what do you think there is
in your book? I do not know, was my
reply. ——— Well dear Sister, I will
tell you; it is very beautiful. And it has

Mother's Love written in it
8717^{times}. Because of your true love to
your Mother. It is written with
white ink, as white as snow.

But I suppose you wonder how that can be done. But you will see it, when you enter Mother's mansion.

Now, said Mother. I suppose by this time, that all the rest of the sisters think that their Books are just like yours.

Why, this is a pretty Book. I shall not take it from you. You may keep it; may she not, Elder Sister? Yea, was the reply. I shall like to have her keep it. I believe that

she is worthy of it.

Now, said Mother, you may come according to your ages; and I will examine your books.

Elizabeth L. come next. Well, said Mother, and what do you think there is in your book? I do not know Mother, was the answer. I hope there is nothing bad.

I will tell you what there is in it. It has Mother's Blessing

Written in it. 6521. times; because
you have ever blest your Mother's
work. And your Mother blesses you.

Then Sarah came. And what
do you think there is in your book?
dear child, said Mother. I do not know, was
the answer. But I am afraid that there
is some smut in it.

O, noy. said Mother. I do not
think there is. You know I used to
help you clean that off, when I was
upon earth with you. I will tell you,

if you want to know, what there is in it. Your Book has Mother's Peace, written in it 7000. times. Because, your Mother is at Peace with you.

The next was Prudence. Well, dear child, said Mother, And what do you think there is in your Book? I do not know, was the answer. Well, said Mother. It is a pretty little book. It has Mother's Truth, written in it 3747. times. Mother asked Elder Sister, if she did not think it was a pretty

book. Yea, it is, was the answer.

Mother asked Prudence, if there was any thing more that she wanted to know, about her book. She answered, yea. I want to know if there is any dirty, nasty places in it. Mother said, there is no room for any thing dirty in your book. It is clean. And it is written as full, as it can hold. You may put it on your head, and keep it.

Next, Angelic kneeled before

Mother to pass examination, as those that came before, had done. Well beloved child, said Mother, what do you think there is in your Book? I do not know; was the answer. I hope I have Mother's love and blessing. That you have, dear child. But that is not all. You have got Mother's Purity, Mother's Peace, & Mother's Faith. And all, ^{that} the other sisters have in their books, you all have. But Mother's Purity is written in your book, 7923. times.

Because, this was a charitable soul.
 And her blessed Mother always prized
this, an excellent gift.

Next Joanna, was called before
 Mother. Well, dear child, said Mother.
 Do you want to know what there is in
 your book? Yea, Mother, was the answer.
 Well, take your book in your right hand,
 and turn the leaves with the other hand; that
 I may see how it looks. - Your book is
 clean, & white. It has Mother's Truth,
 written in it 7997. times. Because,

Said she, you have many times spoken
 truth for your Mother. Also, all that are
 written in the rest; remember, dear child,
 are in yours.

Oliza, was the seventh. Well,
 dear child, said Mother, what think ye
 is in your book? She replied; Mothers
Charity. Ah! Said Mother. You are apt
 to hit it very near right, some times.

Mother's Charity, is there, be sure, but
 that is not all. You have a great

many things in your book. But Mother's Heavenly Love, is written in your book 5683. times. For this you have gained. You did not always possess this love, but this you have truly gained. What can be so pretty? Turn the leaves over. It is a very nice little book. You have made it so, by taking pains to make it clean.

The foregoing are the words which were written upon one side of this Heart; and upon the other side is written the following:

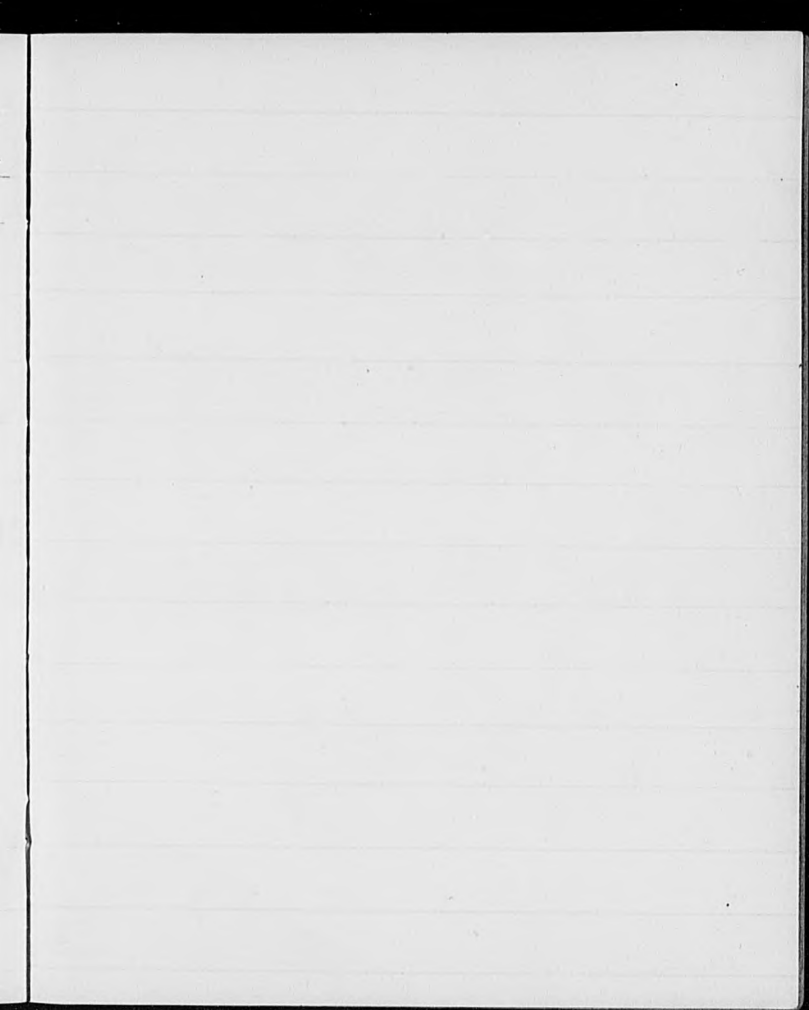

O thou bright and active soul! thou living one of Zion! hear and understand the words I now give unto thee; for with pleasure do I behold thee; and know that it is I, the Saviour of man, who now speak ~~eth~~ unto thee. Yea and my word shall be peace unto thee: for in love thou hast sought to do the will of thy heavenly parents, and walked in lowly obedience to the

requirements of the Gospel, and in love obeyed the word of the Lord —

Yea, beloved One, this thou hast done, & hast also desired to know more of the things of God. Yea, thou hast been willing, to sacrifice sleep, food or clothing, to know and understand the things of God. For this thou art numbered among the humble seekers of thy Heavenly Father's Kingdom. Yea, my beloved One! I am he who is called the

4 Saviour of man, the Son of God. Even so
it is. But still I am unknown to the
lost Children of this world. They call me
the Saviour of man, but they know not
the meaning thereof. But this I am
permitted to make known unto thee, thou
living Child of God. I was known
only as a mortal. But I am, and
was of God: But upon me did I take
the fallen nature of man, thereby to

show, that all things are possible with God; even to the overcoming of a lost fallen nature: for the powers and faculties of each soul, are given of God the Father, and by yielding obedience to his word & will, each ^{one} can be their own Saviour, and show thereby, all things are possible are possible with God; even as I am set for an example, and the pattern.

Yea beloved Child. I did give up

my natural life, only as a pattern, to show that, that life which each soul possesses in a natural state, is opposed to the purity of God, so that life must be put upon the Cross, and thereby suffer Crucifixion, if Salvation, and redemption they would obtain. Many among the learned Children of this world, have pondered upon this thing: but they knew not the meaning of the word. But in love to

you, do I say. I am the pattern, I am the way. And all who follow me in deed, and in truth, must be their own Saviours. Even as I am the pattern; by yielding obedience, and denying themselves of all that is pleasing to that fallen nature with which each soul is endow-

? ed. Yea, I say, again I am the pattern.

But I suffered not to redeem souls from a lost fallen nature, but to show, that that life must be crucified, and put to death, if they even find salvation or

redemption from sin. In this way my beloved, am I the Redeemer, and Saviour of mankind. And thus have I spoken. Not so much for myself, but to help thy word, when thou art questioned in this thing.

I know that thou understandest, and savourest the things of God; but much cavelling, and questioning thou mayst meet on this wise. Therefore am I permitted to say thus to strengthen thy word.

For know, beloved, many believe that thro' my sufferings, their sins were pardoned. Nay, not so - I suffered for an example; yea an example of Obedience, to show forth the will of God: that all must be given up, even to the natural life. Therefore do I say again, each one is a Saviour for himself in this way: and I, even the Saviour to all, am an example of this. - These my words are few concerning this; but by the wise it will be understood;

but to the foolish, the careless & unbeliever,
 it will be like words of no meaning, and an
 empty sound. But to you beloved do I say;
 thou savourest the word of God, and seek to
 understand aright: but to strengthen thy word,
 have I spoken thus. But again do I say;
 in time, more shall be known concerning
 this. For my Heavenly Father saith unto me,
 "Thou, the Son of God, shall yet be ^{fully} revealed to
 mortals; but in Wisdom, not yet. For, lo!

"Zion is not ready." Therefore my beloved, am I permitted to say thus. I, the Saviour, am not fully made known to mortals as I am; even my beginning; for I am of God. But I am permitted to say no more of this now: so in obedience must I move, and in wisdom must I walk, even for an example in all things. But again; I am permitted to say thus. Thou shalt be comforted in the knowledge of what was, and is, and is to come. Thou shalt see, and hear, and understand the same. Thou shalt

delight in the pure word of God which thou
 shalt hear, if Zion walk humbly, and find
 favor. Yea beloved, the mind and will of
 God shall thou know, by means unknown to
 mortals. For that, in wisdom is not yet fully
 revealed; fearing Zion become haughty, and
 exult because of the notice she hath received,
 and take to herself the glory. For to him alone
 is honor due, who in mercy, and in love hath
 visited her; not to Zion, nor the inhabitants

thereof. Now thou holy Anointed One! In love to you, and in obedience, have I thus spoken these words to thee: and with wisdom art thou clothed sufficient to know the meaning thereof. For behold I say unto thee! The caviler and unbeliever from afar, will beset thee in this thing. Even the professor of this gospel, shall doubt my word in this. many ways, in many shapes, and in many forms,—
 yea, the trying day is at hand, and many will
 stand like statues, petrified at the Sound; unless
 aroused by the warnings of the holy Anointed, who
 in wisdom then must sound, sound, warnings
 upon warnings, in Zion, upon her borders, and in
 her secret places— And, in that day, shall they
 have strength so to do— But O Beloved,
 my word is peace unto thee. Yea, peace shall
 rest upon thee: for thou hast faithfully

laboured to do the mind and will of God,
in all things— A place of rest thou shalt
find in the bright mansions above, even a
Recorder, of the word of God.—

Yea, my beloved this fountain, shall be placed in the hall, by the side of Mother's room, so that the holy Anointed may bathe, or drink from this fountain. A Ball of Holy Wisdoms Words given Feb-27th written 28th

Directed to the Holy Anointed.

Holy Wisdoms Will concerning the closing day of Her Visitation

March 1st 1842.

Think not, O my Holy Anointed Ones, that you will pass
unnoticed by me your Holy & Eternal Mother. Not so, my
well beloved. Altho I have spoken but little in your pres-
ence, in my last Visitation, yet I have been with you,
and I have conversed with you in Spirit, concerning many

things. I have obtained the secret desire of your hearts
to know & do my holy will. And in my love, yea in my
farewell love to you, I have marked out the paths for your
feet to tread, so long as you continue on Earth.

Therefore mourn not, my beloved Ones, for my wisdom is
boundless as the sky over your heads: and I will not
forsake you in the hour of darkness; but I will con-
tinue to watch over you, & you shall be directed by my
wisdom. You are lovely in my sight. You are my own.
And think ye, I will ever forgett, or cease to love my own?
Nay this I never never do. Much I have prepared

for you to receive from my hand according to my holy will & pleasure: And a Vessel I have prepared in my wisdom unseen, to fill with my Spirit, thro which I shall make known all that I have prepared & will still keep in my own hands for you. So be ye comforted, for you shall see & know that all my words shall be fulfilled, and that naught cometh out of my Mouth in vain.

And again do I say unto you— know ye, that I have not passed by you lightly. But my words I have written with my finger, and with my finger I will cause them to be revealed unto you.

Now my beloved, I will make known the Order of my departure from the Earth. At the last hour & the last moment of the Appointed day, I will leave the earth and enter into my Mansion of safety in my glory. And this time you know is very near. Therefore I have measured my appointments & formed my holy Order of closing my word with you, face to face.

At the hour of nine O'clock I will close my mouth & thus cease to sound forth my word to the body of this Church: and it is my will, to have the 2nd Order then return to their dwellings in haste, & as much as

possible in silence. And after this, I will continue
to attend meeting with the first Family, till the 10th
hour is expired. I will then leave them in their meet-
ing, to receive what I shall have poured upon them:
I will leave them in care of their Elders attended by
many thousand holy Angels; and myself with the
Father, accompanied by our Son & Daughter, will
retire with the holy Anointed (if this would be pleasing
to you) in the upper part of the Sanctuary: And here,
I will converse with you face to face even as I do unto
the holy Angels before my Throne in Heaven. And

whatsoever ye shall ask of me, that I will reveal unto
you in safety, in the presence of my two witnesses, even
my Son & Daughter; And with the mouth that I have
chosen, I will converse freely with you till the 11th hour
is expired. And then, my two mortal witnesses (Betsey
and Abriah,) may come into my presence; and my holy
will concerning the last hour, you will then know.

O my beloved Anointed Ones, thus have I, in my love,
and condescension, purposed to take my leave of you; &
you feel union & pleasure in this my appointment—
Even so let it be. From Holy Mother Wisdom, in union with the
Eternal Holy Father.

1842. Feb. 28th P. M. Holy Mother's Words to the Ministry
concerning their Chest of clothing; with which, Holy holy
Mother clothed them herself, before the coming of the
Eternal Holy Father

Thus saith Holy Mother Wisdom. — O my beloved An-
ointed Ones, be ye comforted! for, your Holy Mother
will clothe you with my own hands, even as a Mother
doth clothe the Children of her love. Yea this day I have
sent my beloved Messenger (the holy Apostle John) unto
my Mansion: and lo! he has now returned, and has brought

a beautiful Chest which contains the Heavenly Robes,
that I, myself have prepared for you my holy Anointed.
These Robes are without Spot or blemish, perfect &
holy. And these robes you have earned by your faith-
ful labours & deep sufferings which you have passed
thro' to Lead & direct my Lion on Earth.

My well beloved; this is a just reward of your
righteous works. And know ye, that these Robes are
like the bright Cloud with which I was covered, when
I made myself known on the holy Mount & in the Valley.
And tomorrow in the afternoon (March 1st) between

the hours of One & two O'clock, I will clothe you with these bright Robes myself, that you may be clothed ready to meet the Eternal Holy Father: for he will come in his Chariot between the hours of two & three O'clock. Yea these beautiful Robes you are truly worthy to receive. And understand ye my holy words; that these robes are your just reward; but this is not all of your reward, Nay in no wise: for great is the reward which I have choicely secured in my holy Mansion for you my beloved Ones. And when your work is done on Earth, I will then clothe you; and at my Throne

you shall receive that reward which cannot be
revealed to mortals on Earth.

1842. March 1st While at the last Supper with the Lamb & Bride.

When the first born were partakeing of the feast
with Christ & Mother Ann, — Holy Mother Wisdom
stood at the head of the head of the Table & viewed them
all; She would often take something from the table &
give to the holy Anointed herself. And near the last,
she took a very large bunch of white grapes, and gave a
part to each of the Ministry. This bunch of grapes

was something very choice: And Holy Mother said
to the Ministry, O my well beloved, great favour you
have found in my sight; and altho' my beloved Son &
Daughter (your Heavenly Parents) do feed you, yet I will
not refrain from often feeding you, with my own hand.

And know ye, that these precious grapes which I
now give you, are the Strength of your Holy Eternal
Father.
