

have reaped and had a

Daughter, Beautiful and
precious is thy soul in
the sight of God; Thou
hast caused the sorrowful
to rejoice; Thou hast fed

He hungry, and clothed the
naked. And thy joy shall
be full, And thou shalt
go down to thy grave
----- in peace. -----

you, Stand fast, be a
faithful child, and you
shall gain the victory.

I love & bless you; professor,
be faithful & you shall

of God & upon it is written, this is the residence, of a

of the Lord, a valiant soldier of Christ, a Lamb of

Mount Zion. The mansion is built arching, it is
formed of pure & solid gold, the door is formed of diam-
onoids of various kinds, by the hand of your Almighty
heavenly Father. The steps are silver & supported
by two marble pillars by the hand of your Holy
Mother. Within the inward adornings are glor-
ious & beautiful but are not fully known by me
your Mother. Also this work was done by your holy
Mother. Wisdom when she had finished her

ing peace, my never failing blessing, & never ending love. &
know ye that thou dost stand as a faithful servant in Ioreah,
a tree of eternal & everlasting glory & beauty, well loaded
with precious fruit lovely one of Mount Tion.

Words of Father James.

I know ye O thou faithful servant in Ioreah that it
is with much pleasure that I do now place within

the cover of this little book my name, my love & blessing
and my words of comfort to you, because I have known
thee from an early period of thy life, as thy Mother hath
said to be a child of truth, a pattern of meekness, humility
& virtue, faithfulness & industry in your duty, great care
prudent & saving of that which the Lord in his mercy
had bestowed upon his chosen people as a shining
light within the walls of Mount Zion thou hast stood as
an example of the gospel in every deed. And O I
would to God that all my little Lamb had & would

gollow the same. And now, O do O thine faithful servant
of the Lord recieve from me your loving Father James
while I stand upon my bended knees before you, my
never ending true heart felts thanks for truly my spirit
does bow in gratitude & thankfulness to Mother's first
born children for their zeal & integrity & the example-
ary lives they have daily lived, knowing that they
have passed thro' sufferings deep & sorrow done to
maintain & keep the gospel in its purity, as truly they

beautiful little silver plate with a white cake of balsom upon it from John the baptist; also a basket filled with the love of all the Patriarchs, Prophets, of Apostles, also a little gold box filled with my never ending love of blessing, which will never get empty while in time ye remain, with the likeness of Holy Wisdom upon the cover.— I have a little present for Betty says Mother Lucy, if she will be so kind as to receive it; it is a white linen pocket handkerchief with a gold border, 6 inches wide, with my name written in the middle. Be comforted, thou little one, says Mother Lucy; soon you will be released from your afflictions, thy cup of sufferings is nearly filled.— O, says Elder Dr John, be so kind as to receive my everlasting peace, love of blessing, & know ye that I stand as a witness to the truth of Mother's word, that you have ever been a faithful soul, just & upright in all your proceedings thro' life.— Thankful I be says Elder S. Oliver to place my name, & my love of blessing within the covers of this little book for Mother's loving child Betty, which truly I do with much pleasure. So receive my neverending blessing, while I place upon thy forehead a seal of my everlasting love.

The Saviour's word.- Let my never failing love of ever increasing
blessing, cheer thy way while ye do sojourn in time, says the Saviour.
Now, says Mother Ann, receive ye with the parting word
of all your heavenly Parents, the never ending, but
ever increasing peace, love & blessing of Holy

Ann, Father William, Father James, Father Joseph,
Mother Lucy, Elder Br John, Elder D. Olive.

Introduction by Father James.

"Hear, O hear ye, O thou faithful servant of the living God, the word of your affectionate Father James, & know that it was on the 31st of Dec^r 1841, that your blessed Mother Ann approached my mansion, where I was sitting in my chair & seriously meditating upon the things of God, saying, 'James, here is a little book that I want you to write for a well proved, true

and faithful child of my love; art thou now ready
to answer my desire?" "Yea, Mother, but I fear there
is one little child that you have forgotten. I have
often heard her say, "O if I could only receive one
more word from my heavenly Parents, how
thankful I should be." "Who is it James?" said Mother.
"Why it is your little Tziporah." "Think ye," said Mother
"that I should forget such a faithful child of my love? nay,
nay, in no wise, but you will find, if you will now
write this book that it is for that faithful child

about whom you now feel concerned; and I
intend she shall receive this even on the morrow,
which is the first day of the year."

"O Mother I am thankful; I will imme-
diately write it, & your request shall be answered.
I then commenced writing the little book with
much pleasure & satisfaction. So hear ye your
Mother's word.

Mother Anna's Word.

"Think ye, O thou child of thy loving

Mother,) that I could possibly forget a child
that did, even in the days of their youth, freely
gave themselves up to the Lord, & did cheerfully
obey my word to the utmost, & was willing to
spend & be spent, even to the laying down of
their natural life, to maintain the work of me
their Mother: yea, & suffer sorrow, grief, pain,
persecution, cold & hunger for my sake and
the gospels & has ever stood in my house as a
permanent pillar, unshaken by any adverse

wind that has ever⁶ blown?

O know ye my lovely one, your soul
is nearer & dearer to me than anything,
either in the heavens above or on the
earth beneath: nought do I feel so good to
bestow upon you for your comfort; but know
ye, I shall soon call thee home, no more to
sorrow as ye have done, but to rest in a
mansion of eternal & never ending glory,
surrounded by holy Angels & by the sound
of their joy & mirth, tuning their golden

harps with joy, in praise to their God.

Receive ye now without measure
my love, blessing & thanks for your faithfulness,
I know ye you are a child of my love,
& one in whom I am well pleased."

Father William's Word.

"O Tziporah, Tziporah, how thankful I be
that your blessed Mother has permitted
me, with her, to speak a few more words
to you in time, but much more thankful

should I be to meet with you here in
eternity, in that beautiful mansion your
Holy Mother has prepared for you. This I
cannot do, but I will tell you how it looks.

It is built arching, & lined with the love
of God & blue cambric. On the outside it is
covered with gold lace of the love of your
Holy Mother Wisdom. On one side is
placed 1623942 stars resembling the crores
of your life, on the other is written thus,

"This is the residence of a child of the most high, a
faithful servant in the vineyard of the Lord, the
glory of the earth; of a flower of everlasting beauty
in the kingdom of the living God."

"Now I have only given you a few
of the outlines of your mansion, but
thankful I am to give you this; & more
pleased should I be to say more to you;
but Father James says if I say much
more, he shall have to put ~~on~~ an addition

onto his book; or else not have room
to put in one word for himself. And
I cannot bear to put him to so much
trouble, so I part with you in peace &
my neverending blessing.

"I want to know" says Father Jo-
seph "if I can't say one word to Tiporah,
I should think I might; if I don't it will
not be because I do not love her as I do
my own soul." "O ye, Joseph," said Father

to speak) a few words, but you must be
very short & comprehensive, for my heart
aches now for fear I shall have to write
the whole book if not put in one word
for myself." "Well Father, I will tell you, we
will both put in our love & blessing together,
saying, "O do receive this from your affection-
ate Parents, who are now anxiously waiting
to receive you into the happy mansion."

"Yea," says Mother Lucy, "do be so kind






