

O Words of Holy Mother Wisdom,

Written by her own Hand, upon a six square Jasper stone.

To Eldress Ruth,

Her Dearly Beloved and Worthy Child.

Arise, arise, my faithful child and be at this time comforted; for surely thou art not forgotten by me, thy Eternal and ever wise Parent. Holy, holy Wisdom. I have looked upon thee with delight, yea, with joy inexpressible, have I oftentimes viewed thee, and numbered thee with my choicest jewels.

Yea, yea indeed, O thou lovely one of my name, rest ye assured mine eye has long guarded you, my listening ear has not been deaf to thy oft repeated intercessions and supplications, for the welfare and protection of all Zion's children far and near.

Say, nay not so, but freely upon thee, have I poured even with my right hand, true Wisdom, Knowledge, and perfect understanding, whereby thou hast been enabled to protect, to lead, and to direct the household of Israel aright, and in safety.

O then, my worthy, my faithful and true child, think not that thy unnumbered hours of sorrow, thy very many days of bitter grief, and deep tribulation, yea and thy often repeated scenes of heavy affliction of soul that have rolled o'er thee for 20 long, long years, have in any wise passed unnoticed or unseen by me, thy ever Holy and Eternally wise Parent, and Mother of true and perfect Love.

Yea, by me, thy ever protecting and watchful Mother, even by me Holy Wisdom, or by the Holy Angels that constantly surround my Throne, and wait before

me, the praises, and the prayers of the faithful burden bearers of my Holy people, have all thy afflictions, and all thy soul grieving, and heart rending scenes of trial by day and by night, been seen, been known, and are remembered indeed.

So my beloved grieve not upon thy tribulation, and reflect not upon thy past sorrows. Regret not the loss of thy right hand beloved one, that long ago I took from thee, but know ye, and remember that from that day I have ever watched and guarded you, have supported, directed, fed and nourished you; have often whispered aloud in your ear my desires; have moved your tongue to speak, have poured forth upon ^{you} my Holy power, and my true Wisdom I have in no wise withheld from you, but oft have I clothed you with it; The work of thy ^{hand} have prospered, and the same I do bless indeed.

Thy humble cries, thy fervent prayers, and thy very earnest desires for the little ones of my Zion; and in the behalf of all Israel have not passed unheard, O thou most worthy one! neither have they been poured forth in vain. Nay in no wise, neither has thy exceeding true patience, thy perseverance in the cause of good, thy exact and perfect obedience to the word, will, and example of thy parents before thee, passed unnoticed in the heavens above.

For surely in the Holy book of Life, thy name is engraven, and upon the Eternal Record which I hold in my right hand, thy sorrows, thy afflictions, thy troubled hours, thy heavy burdens, thy hard toil for these many years are all written and printed and can plainly be read, and many, yea many do they number indeed.

Also upon the same Holy Record in letters of gold,
are printed your true righteous deeds, your repeated
act of virtue, your unerring godly example, your
very exceeding wise dealings with the Holy givings of
your Heavenly Father, your perfect love to your ever-
blessed Mother Ann, and all your heavenly parents,
yea, and the sacred reverence, and holy fear with
which you have ever received their holy gospel.

This is my word unto thee, O my worthy one, and
surely thou mayest indeed be comforted with it, for it
is verily true, and all that I shall say, or all that I
shall give unto thee at this time, is thy just merit; and
surely due unto thee; for to give thee a token of my
perfect satisfaction with thee, it is, that I now write
unto thee upon this precious & beautiful Jasper Stone,
which with my own hand I have prepared & written thereon.

But listen yet longer, and let thy weary soul rest from its heavy burdens and labors, yea lay by thy sorrows a short moment, and let thy spirit be cheered within thee, even as I thy Holy Mother this morn have done, to write the word of this short Roll unto thee my lovely child.

And now upon thy head with my own hand will I place, a most beautiful Crown, and many, yea many are the pretty and lovely Diamonds which encircle it; These are marks of the many scenes of true tribulation thro' which thou hast passed, since thou wast bereaved of thy beloved and true friend Mother Lucy.

Again I say, upon this bright Crown 500,055, \$00, stars of great beauty shine, for even so many do the crosses number that you, my beloved and worthy child, have born, ever since you have been called by my Wisdom to stand as the first Leading Mother in my Holy House.

Yea I say, even so many do the crosses number,
that you have cheerfully borne, for the sake of
me, even Eternal Wisdom, your Holy Mother, for
in Wisdom you have walked, in wisdom you have
spoken, in Wisdom, (altho' thro' severe tribulation)
did you counsel, strengthen, and administer unto
Zion, in dark and gloomy days, even before the full
time had arrived for you to receive assistance from
your parents above, at my command.

In true wisdom, and to my perfect satisfaction
you have directed my manifestation on earth; my will
you have done, my Visitation throughout Zion you have
blessed; and now I do say unto thee; My Wisdom is
yours; My peace be unto you at all times; My Love
unbounded, and My Blessings unceasing, shall flow
upon you by day and by night, thro' time.

My Holy Angels you have readily entertain'd as doing me honor, and have thankfully received from them all that I bid them to hand unto you, and of them you are blessed at morning and evening; and repeated praises do they sound thro' the heavens, even to thy name; and of thee they do sing peace, peace and good will all the day long, while thousands of angels reecho the sound, & many Saints, & justified spirits rejoice at the same.

Your everblessed Mother Ann, and her lovely companions with her, which I did send forth filled with my Holy spirit, to assist and succour my Holy chosen ones, and to, if possible relieve their burdened spirits in some measure concerning the distressed situation of of my Zion; I say, these, you did receive and freely did make them wellcome; and more than this, you have thankfully acknowledged their power, at all times.

Their word you did receive, their work you did own and bless; Therefore you are blessed of them, yea surely they own, love, & bless you; their peace they have ^{upon} powered you, for truly they are at peace with you; & when your labors on earth are ended, they will joyfully receive & welcome ^{your} home to dwell with them;

Yea my beloved, hand in hand shall you walk the lovely streets of the Holy City, even the new Jerusalem with your blessed Mother Ann, and your well beloved Mother Lucy; and the reward which is now already prepared, & which thou shall receive in full measure from their hands, when with them you meet in their mansions of rest, will be bounteous, glorious & beautiful.

Because of your most faithful servitude, toil & labors, & the heavy burden thou hast borne for these

very many long years in the sacred order of Gods holy chosen; I say because of all this, they will not fail to reward thee abundantly, and for the same, will I, Holy Wisdom, with my own hand reward thee.

It is a square Basket made of Olive-wood bark by Ruth of old. In it I have put a glass jar of sweet meats, a bottle of sweet wine. 
