The deed Speaks of itself and Every person acquainted with the unostentatious Character of the generous Donors must be sensible that it was not done for Praise sake. but we have strong motives for mentioning such a Deed we wish to show the proud Rich man an Example worthy of his imitation Therefore if he has a heart to feel Let him go and do likewise.
