Hudson Cayley 29. 1845.

I have this day made a settlement with Jonathan Wood, of his claim of \$54 against W & W Richard, by giving him my personal note at ninety days for Thirty Dollars, besides Two Dollars in money, with this condition that if the said firm of W & W Richard shall on the final adjustment of their liabilities be able to pay their creditors all their claims, or a higher proportion of them than the amount thus paid to Jon. Wood bears to his claim, they shall pay to said Jon. Wood the balance of his claim or such a proportion of it as their assets shall authorize.
