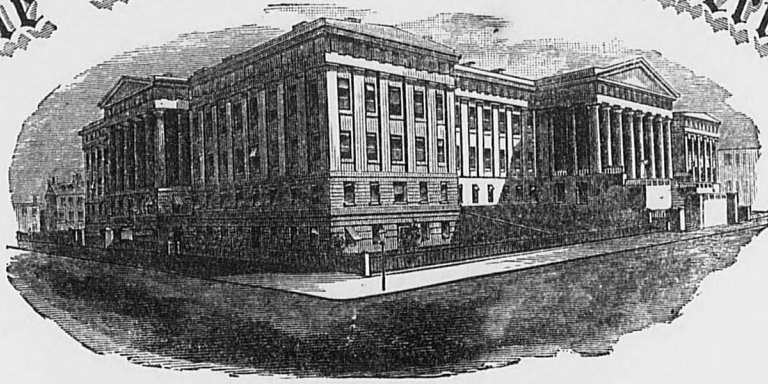

TRADE-MARK FOR LONG CLOAKS.

STATEMENT and DECLARATION of Trade-Mark No. 37,336, registered November 26, 1901.

Application filed September 20, 1901.

STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, E. J. NEALE & Co., a firm domiciled and doing business in the town of New Lebanon, in the county of Columbia and State of New York, have adopted for our use a Trade-Mark for Garments, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

Our trade-mark consists of representations of a female figure wearing a long flowing cloak with a cape and by which cloak the figure, excepting the head, is enveloped. The representations have generally been arranged as shown in the accompanying facsimile, containing front and back views of the figure and cloak, although they have also been used on labels containing the name and post-office address of the firm and the words "Shaker Cloak," these last-named words appearing in white against a black background of oval shape. This printed matter may, however, be omitted or changed without altering the character of the trade-mark, the essential fea-

ture of which is the front and back representations of a female figure wearing a long flowing cloak enveloping the figure and provided with a cape.

This trade-mark has been used continuously in our business since about the month of January, 1897.

The class of merchandise to which this trade-mark is appropriated is outer garments for women, and the particular description of goods comprised in such class upon or in connection with which we use the said trade-mark is long cloaks.

The trade-mark is used on labels attached to the cloaks and is also printed on circulars used in advertising the cloaks.
