To wit, Said Land is bounded on the east, north and west by lands previously owned by said United Society at New Lebanon, and on the south by lands owned by William Isaac Ruger, said premises containing seven & a half acres of land be the same more or less.

I have and to hold the aforegranted premises with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Edu^r Fowler and Benj^r Gates in their capacity of trustees as aforesaid and their successors in that office and to their use and behoof forever.

And I the said George Winchell for myself and my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns do covenant with the said Fowler & Gates and their successors as trustees as aforesaid, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the before granted premises and that they are free from all incumbrances. That I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Fowler and Gates and their successors as trustees and assigns as aforesaid. And that I will and my heirs executors administrators and assigns shall warrant and defend the same to the said Fowler and Gates, their successors or assigns forever against the lawful claims of all persons.
