Sept. 12: Freegift Wells, drove spiling 36 ft. to the rocks, to bring up water, & in scraping the bottom next the rocks, he drew up a small round clam to all appearance as fresh & sound as if just taken from the sea.

Mother An's remains & Dr. Wm's were taken up May, 1835 - small coffins made for the bones & they were reinterred on the 12th in center of grave yard - the bones were free to inspection while caskets were being made. On the left side of Mother's skull was a fracture, said to be made when she was dragged down stairs, feet foremost at Petersham. Fracture of 1 1/2 in. was plainly visible above Dr. Wm's left temple.

Made, according to his own account by one of his persecutors in Eng. who gave him a severe blow with a fire poker. Witnessed by Eld Rufus B. Believers trouble at Sodus Bay began in 1836
