to be made, we bind ourselves our heirs, executors  
and administrators, firmly by these presents.

one thousand eight hundred and forty eight

The Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bounden  
David & Moses D. their

heirs, executors or administrators, shall well and truly pay, or cause to be paid  
unto the above named Jonathan & Edward their  
executors, administrators or assigns, the just and full sum of Two Hundred  
dollars - in manner & form following, viz. Fifty dollars  
upon the delivery of one certain deed, from Jonathan Wood  
& Edward Fowler, to Moses D. Cambell - and the ballance  
of One Hundred and fifty dollars & interest, on the first  
day of July 1849 -

then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
