

Sent 4 calves to New York - one was Myrtle
had strawberries & shortcakes. ^{3 months & 1 week.}
24+26 Wed. Mer. 6⁵ at noon. Cloudy. N. west.
More strawberries, & some fresh fish.
Mowed grass by saw-mill & cherry trees.
Visitors came from Enfield J. H.
Charles Carter on a visiting tour.
25+21 Thur. Mer. 7⁵ at noon. Pleasant.
Mowed east of road & north of sawmill.
Spoke to visitors near by school-house.

Powered by sawmill dam & south of mill dam ^{pond}.

Excellent cherries this year - being picked.

One had strawberries to day. ^(E) house.

Ed. O'Connell broke my hair rope twice ⁴ into.
10+19 Fri. Mar. 75 at noon. Sunny day.
Getting in hay from west meadow.
Some Sisters an Mt. for whortleberries.
Mowed grass north of & by medicine house.
Center family man mowed there with machine.
Black Branch & Little Black had heifer calves. 8th.
11+26 Sat. Mar. 79 at noon. Good hay weather.
Mowed grass south tan house & school house,
12+27 Sun. Mar. 80 at noon. Fine clear day.
Quite a lively society meeting. 1 1/2 hours.
13+30 Mon. Mar. 81 at noon. Spreading hay.
Mowed grass & weeds by tan house pond. &c.
14+33 Tues. Mar. 85 at noon. Some clouds in north.
Mowed 2 loads of grass north of garden by pond.
Ken getting in excellent hay.
Another heifer has a dull calf.
15+40 Wed. Mar. 88 at noon. Thunder ^{west} in the
Mowed 3 jags grass west side tan house.
John Dalton 17 yrs. old 14th of last March,
came here May 3rd 1882 - debricated.
Doretta Horton to St. Louis Missouri. Fr. 10th.
16+32 Thurs. Mar. 90 at noon. Cool, cloudy.
Mowed a load grass Mr. east sawmill pond.
Had 1/8 inch rain 15th inst. Total 1 1/2 inches.
some 30 yrs. or so, ago, it was 101 in the shade N. E.

17+23 Fri. Mar. 76 at noon. Clouds coming.
A company on south mountain for whortleberries.
Mowed grass south of sawmill pond. Ed mowed
some by Ministry, & some cornfodder in field.

18+29 Sat. Mar. 76 afternoon. Fine rain.
Mowed meeting, & door-yard grassed.
A company on Mt. again for whortleberries.
Heard that young Johnson at south Fr. was hurt.
Somebody threw 13 swillpails out of north door
& tore away grape vine by butt ^{cow barn} _{out}.
The bull went into orchard through barn yard gate.

Ed doctored a cow, to which I objected taking part.

Charles Carter comes home from 3 1/2 weeks
Ed mowed H. House & I road side grass.

One of feed drawers at north calf pen missing.

21+29 Tues. Mar. 72 at noon. Partly cloudy.
Had small thunder shower. Total 10. 2 3/8

Glass window broke on driving floor.

Mowed grass by road, & meeting yard & mowed
Bobby Lankford Langbridge came this evening. ^{thistles} _{in orchard}

22+24 Wed. Mar. 79 at noon. Ministry came 10 A.M.
Had new potatoes 3 days later than last year.
Ed mowed in office. & finished road side. (5)

Mowed a load of grass by machine shop.
Ed mowed a load south of dairy house.
Charles Carter got a horse & 5 dollars for his outfit,
said he did not want to go away.

28+18 Tues. Mar. 72 at noon. N. West yet.
Mowed grass & weeds east of machine shop.
New team drawing eye from Hatch lot. 21
loads.

29 + 32 Wed. Mar. 24 at noon. 98 rain.
Charles Carter dead & mutilated. Total $3\frac{1}{2}$
I mowed a load of grass south of sawmill
Ed mowed a load beside the road.

Men took 2 fat steers away to Jolls.

Budd took 2 fat calves. wt. 150 & 192.

30 + 30 Thur. Mar. 25 at noon. Looks rainy.
Mowed a load grass ^{& Ed. by road} south of sawmill pond.

James Burke cut 3 wood windows in shed about ^{By}
^{so pieces} 9' & 2' ^{wide} ^{high} ^{12 ft. long} ^{gravel}.
James Winter 2 yrs. old went to Utica to live.

31 + 19 Fri. Mar. 26 at noon. Partly ^{cloudy} & R. west.

Mowed a load grass south west of machine shop.

Ave. for July 1891. 26 - 2 days. colder than last year.

Had $\frac{1}{3}$ rain yesterday. Total $4\frac{7}{8}$ inches.

Men brought some loads hay from Patterson place.

Aug. 1. 1891.

1 + 18 Sat. Mar. 27 at noon. Looks rainy.

Mowed a load south of machine shop, ^{& by kiln} ^{Ed. Connell}.

Men getting home hay from Patterson.

2 + 28 Sun. Mar. 28 at noon. Meeting as usual.

Had a very light rain last night.

Had whoosberry pie for dinner.

3 + 20 Mon. Mar. 29 at noon. Some clouds.

Mowed a load grass ^{& binned thistles in west orchard} south east of machine shop.

E. D. Cogswell is whitewashing cow barns.

4 + 30 Tues. Mar. 30 ⁹⁹ at noon. Raining a little.

Cleaned hog pens & littered them. (B)

2 more whitewashed my cow stable wall. (8)

Wet after 9th & rain this afternoon & night after.

5+29 Wed. Mar. 7th at noon. Light rain.

I finished whitewashing bare wall. Ed is at his stable.

6+30 Thur. Mar. 8th at noon. Partly cloudy. Whitewashing.

I mowed grass & weed &c. south east mac. shop.

Ed O'Connell doing more whitewashing.

He had water melons & cabbage for dinner.

7+30 Fri. Mar. 8th at noon. Cloudy in north.

I mowed thistles on dam breast & in north orchard.

Shook hands with Eld. A. Barret this morning in farm.

Had more water melons last eve & for dinner.

8+32 Sat. Mar. 9th at noon. Wind northerly.

Mowed burdocks, weeds, bushes, south of joiners ^{had ice cream for supper} shop.

9+32 Sun. Mar. 10th at noon. No society meeting.

Eld. Andrew Barret was in our home meeting.

Had light rain preventing families coming.

10+36 Mon. Mar. 11th at noon. Good breeze.

Mowed burdocks, weeds &c. with corn knife south.

Ed & I brought 2 hand load cornfodder ^{of lane} for cows.

Ferdinand & Co. picking early pears for market.

11+38 Tues. Mar. 12th at noon. Some clouds.

I mowed some bushes, burdocks, weed &c.

12+3rd Wed. Mar. 13th at noon. ^{1/2 inch rain} Thunder showers.

I buried rubbish in west orchard. I mowed a wheelbarrow of grass in garden for pigs.

I cut another large load of cornfodder.

Ed came home last eve. with bull - took 1st prize
\$15 dollars I hear - I ducked 1st prize \$10 dollars

12+16 Sat. Mar. 73 at noon. Cut a large load corn.

Had onions for dinner, 3 in number.
^{Dug my Bermuda com-potatoes} Had peaches after dinner.

I was sleepy this evening - I did not get to meeting.

Eld. Timothy led the meeting.

21+24 Mon. Mar. 79 at noon. Fell in trap door.

Made a new trap door on driving floor.

Resumed sweet corn business. Eugene's horse

Sweet corn business progressing decidedly.

23+35 Wed. Mar. 77 at noon. Partly cloudy to day.

Ed. C. & Co. Coon hunting. Ed said they caught 4. I doubt it.
Sisters putting up tomatoes at a great rate.

24+31 Thur. Mar. 80 at noon. Partly cloudy & smoky.
Older Augusta & Co. picked some peaches 2 3² bushels.
Adeline gave me 6 peaches this morning.

Finished picking & nearly bushing sweet corn.

25+30 Fri. Mar. 80 at noon. Clear but smoky.

Cornelia & Co. nearly finish tomatoe business.
Plenty had a heifer calf lower barn.

26+33 Sat. Mar. 76 at noon. Some clouds in north.
Finished bushing sweet corn finally.

Aun Maria brought me 3 peaches & some $\frac{3}{4}$ lbs.
Had no meeting this evening, but some good hints.

27+33 Sun. Mar. 76 at noon. Peachy day.
Old James Little & Ed French spoke good.
