- 1<sup>st</sup> Clean your shoes well before you enter.
- 2<sup>d</sup> Pull off your hat as you enter the Door.
- 3 None to<sup>o</sup> up or down stairs without liberty.
- 4 None to<sup>o</sup> out in school time without liberty.
- 5 No speaking together when out without liberty; unless really necessary, and then when you come in to inform the teacher.
- 6 No meddling with the Desk; or others Books.
- 7 No chewing tobacco, Liquorice &c in school.
- 8 No whispering or laughing; nor talking except to the Monitors; and that necessary.
- 9 No excusing in spelling; or teaching each other.
- 10 No shoving or striking each other.
- 11 No one to read louder than his class.
- 12 No gazing and looking about; especially at strangers or spectators.
- 13 No giving of Gifts or trading.
- 14 No telling worlds stories or any indecent language before school begins.

- 15 No telling tales out of school.
- 16 No telling of the proceedings, of your own order where you live; to other orders.
- 17 Never to drink more than twice in half a day or an evening without liberty.
- 18 Always go and come, to and from school in order; not play by the way.
