NOTE: Except where noted otherwise, these items are original handwritte books. Until recently, they were in the hands of the highest leaders of the Shakers — the central Ministry— and kep as among the most sacred and important records of the Society. All items are one-of-akind.

Includes innermost records of the Society during the mysterious period of "whisions, visitations and celestial gifts" in the 1830's and early 1840's.)
